2- WASH UP! Targets

- WASH UP! Pilot Project in Lebanon target is to help children adequate healthy and hygienic behaviours through set of training in the most vulnerable communities to reduce risks of disease and to raise caution among two different societies:

I- Lebanese Host Community :

- 6 Classes
- Total participants : 147 Children
- Trained Teachers : 12

II- Syrians Refugees :

- 5 Classes
- Total participants : 255 Children
- Trained Teachers : 5

Total Participants : 210 Girls, 192 Boys (402)

I – Lebanese Host Community

- Through : 6 Community Centers in Akkar Area – North Lebanon

Age group : 3-12

Each Class = 2 Teachers

1 World Vision Supervisor







II – Syrians Refugees

- Through : 5 Psycho-Social Support (PSS) centers in Akkar Area – North Lebanon

Age Group : 6-12

Each Class = 1 Animator (Teacher)

3- Key Learnings :

- The monitoring of the programme helped us to adjust it on many levels :
 - Video editing: Some changes to Raya and Elmo's behaviour during the handwashing video
 - Language used by Raya and Elmo in the videos – Spoken Arabic was easier for the children than the formal one.
 - To use more simple symbols understandable by both Lebanese and Syrian children since they have almost the same principles but different way of life.

4- Feedback:

- Teachers' feedback: WASH UP! Was very useful for the children from both communities
 - “Sessions start at 9am, the children used to come at 8am”
 - “I had a call from a mother thanking us for changing her son's behaviours”
- Children in the Lebanese community were very happy to attend the training: “We had so much fun and we can't wait to attend the next session” as per one of the children.
- Sessions conducted during psycho-social support classes supplemented the existing curriculum, --“The programme helped us delivering hygienic messages in a very easy and understandable way” as per one of the teachers.
- From one child: “I was very glad to learn and to teach my siblings at the camp so we all become super heroes like Raya”
