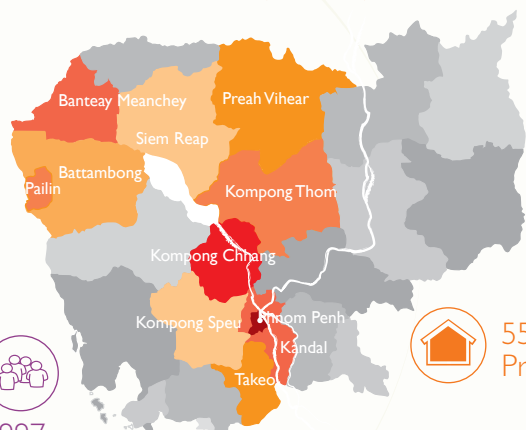

Because of weak child protection systems, unwillingness to report violations, and effects of poverty, it is important that we focus on protecting children from abuse and exploitation. We do this by improving community protection mechanisms, by helping families provide a caring environment for children, especially the most vulnerable, and by teaching children life skills and resilience so that they can protect themselves.

Due to an inadequate education system, hierarchical cultural norms, limited economic opportunities and lack of parental support, we focus on empowering youth to be creative and active citizens - prepared for leadership. Through life skills training, communications for development, entrepreneurial training and micro projects youth are more hopeful and better prepared to take control of their future.

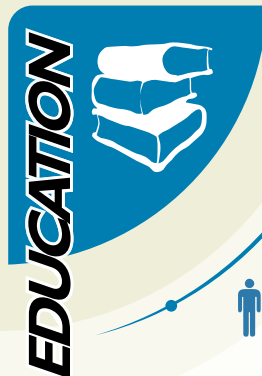
With a weak public health system, food insecurity, lack of sanitation and clean water, poor infant feeding practices and low rates of post natal care, 40% of children under 5 are malnourished. By supporting mothers to breastfeed and caregivers to provide nutritious food, by improving government policy implementation, and by helping families have increased access to nutritious food, we aim to see children healthy and well nourished, free from infection and disease.

19,450 people benefitted from infrastructure support

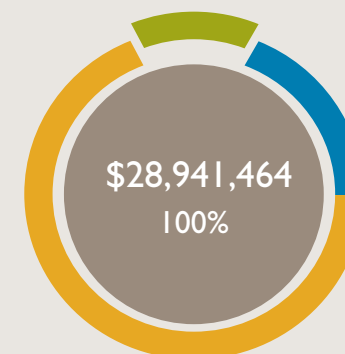
Only 56% of children in grade 6 can read or write, due to a lack of qualified teachers, inadequate educational materials, limited financial resources and weak collaboration and support from government agencies. To improve this we support teacher training, children's clubs where kids engage in innovative extracurricular learning activities, and community engagement to increase the quality of learning, because children are attending school but many are not learning.
