The Community's life back in 2008



Only **70.5%** of children aged 6-14 were enrolled in school.



60% of the community could not read and write.



60% of the population was displaying signs of vulnerability.



Over **40%** of the population was unhealthy because of the lack of adequate sanitation.



99.9% of the population did not have toilets.

Programme Goal

Empower community people, partners, and youths to improve the well-being and livelihood of the most vulnerable children.










