Only **70.5%** of children aged 6-14 were enrolled in school.



60% of the community could not read and write.



60% of the population was displaying signs of vulnerability.



Over **40%** of the population was unhealthy because of the lack of adequate sanitation.



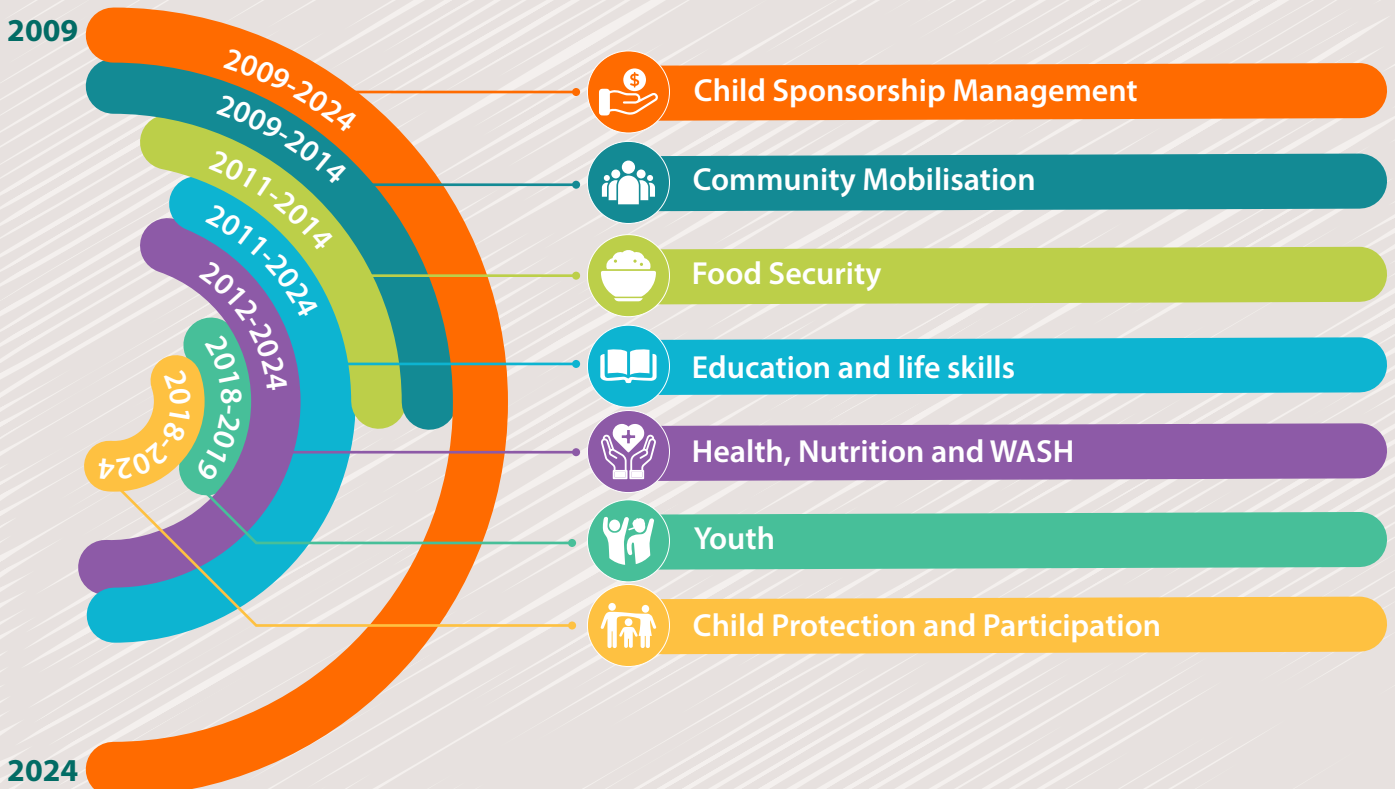
99.9% of the population did not have toilets.

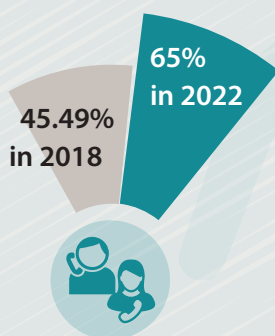

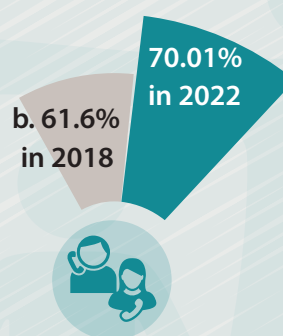
4 Water connection systems and water supply stations **among 6** managed by Agriculture Cooperatives directly benefiting **2,703** children.



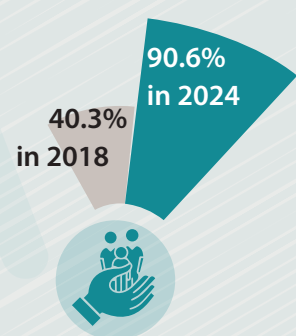
Child Protection and Participation



Adolescents aware of public services to respond to the reports of abuse, neglect, exploitation, or violence against children



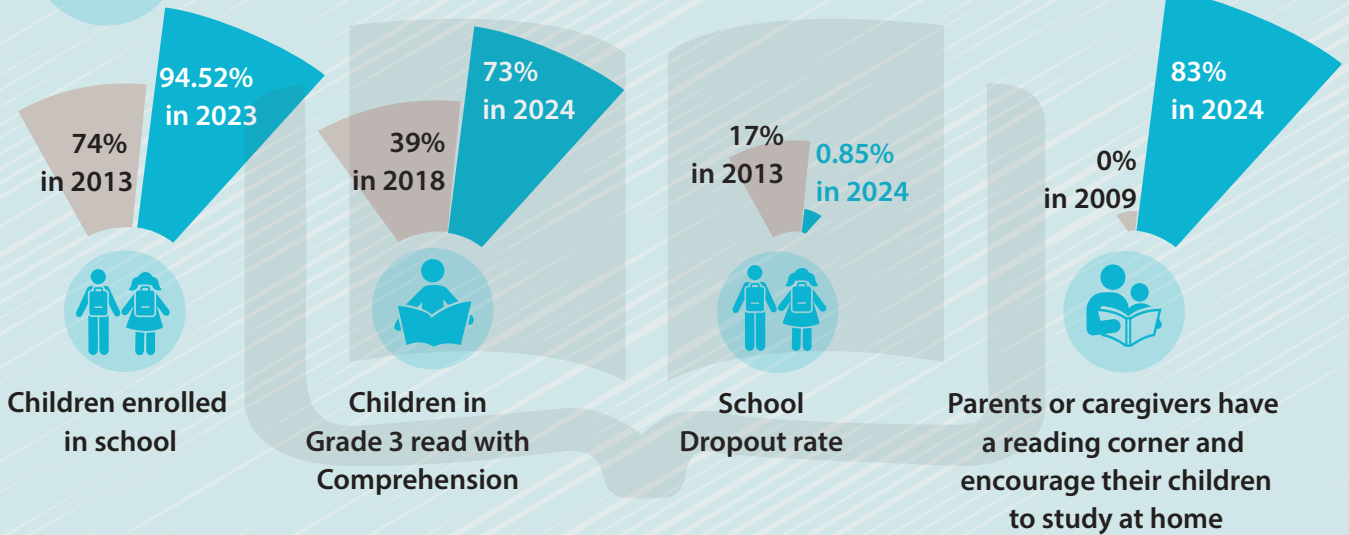
Children aged 12-18 report living in a safe and protected environment with their families



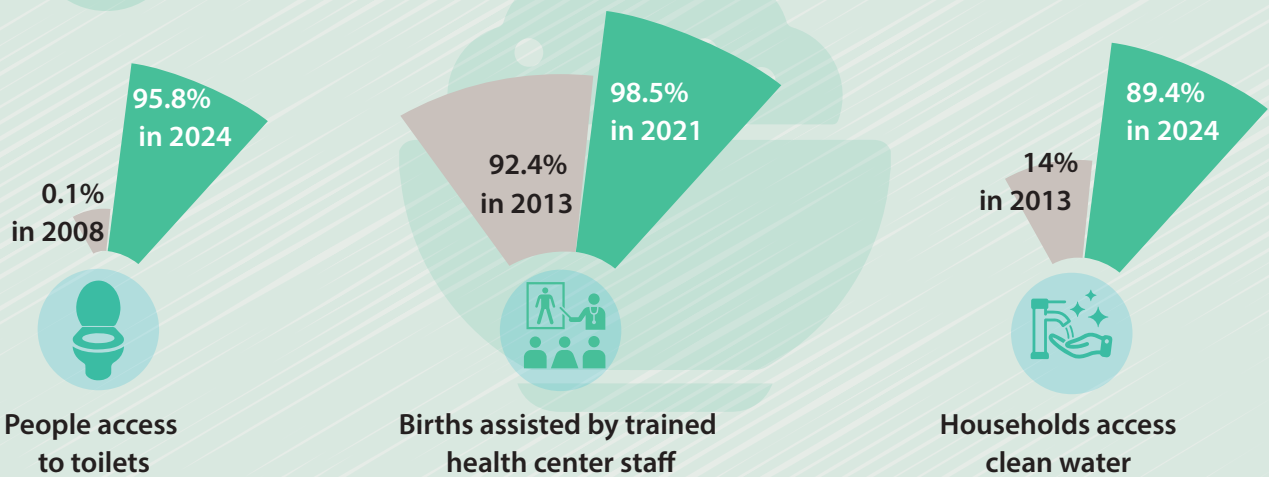
