





📵 HEALTH : TB/HIV

2023 Highlights

- Global Fund contributed to increase TB case notification in 11 provinces (34,203 patients with drug-susceptible TB and 808 multidrug resistant TB patients); with 75% complete treatment completion rate per government report; whereas 46,733 key population group were reached; including HIV testing services for 36,225 individuals and HIV testing facilities in 8 provinces. 1,515 HIV positive pregnant women received anti-retroviral treatment to reduce the risk of transmission of HIV to their babies.
- To strengthen the health system, the GF project procured HIV and TB drugs and laboratory commodities to complement the Government's procurement and effectively managed e-LMIS (electronic Logistics Info Management System) in 149 sites in 22 provinces. The repair of Physical Containment 3 (PC3) laboratory section of Central Public Health Laboratory in PNG is also completed, along ongoing implementation of medical oxygen plants in 2 provincial hospitals and medical incinerators in 10 hospitals.
- WVPNG strengthened the capacity of local partners through partner capacity reviews, compliance related sensitization and supportive supervisory visits. As Principal Recipient (PR), World Vision works with provincial health authorities and NDoH for joint planning and monitoring exercises in most provinces.
- Specifically in Western, under DFAT support, the TB treatment in 2023 saw increased success rate of treatments. In total, 3,050


patients (929 Male, 879 Women, 662 Boys and 580 Girls) received DOTS, TB treatment, through the network of treatment supporters across the province. For treatment supervision and support, Western achieved commendable treatment success rates, with Daru reaching 88.6%, Balimo at 84%, and Kiunga at 60% in effectively treating patients with drug-sensitive TB, catering to diverse demographics.

In NCD, under World Bank support, treatment success rate for bacteriologically confirmed TB cases increased to 90%, demonstrating the project's effectiveness in improving patient outcomes. Over 3,300 presumptive TB patients were tested with Gene Xpert technology; while 81% screening rate was achieved.



MATERNAL CHILD HEALTH & NUTRITION


- With the support of the DFAT AIHSS project, WV reached an accumulated total of 752,372 people across Western, Madang, Morobe Provinces. That includes 93,228 pregnant women via ANC visits and Tetanus Toxoid vaccinations: and 658.144 children who have received Pentavalent, bOPV, IPV, Measles Rubella, PCV, BCG, Hep B vaccinations, nutritional support and used outreach clinics.
- WVPNG also strengthened leadership capacity of Provincial Health Authorities (PHAs) through AIHSS project, through supporting 139 health facilities in development of micro plans on a yearly basis; 480 supervisory visits; 26 review meetings; so that there is better coordination of interventions and an increase in immunization trends.
- Under DFAT Better and Enhanced Agriculture for Nutrition (BEAN) project, WV worked to improve nutrition outcomes through better production, availability and affordability of diverse nutrition food. A total of 72 lead farmers (36 male and 36 female) have been supported with gardening tools and 14 different varieties of vegetable seeds and crops to cultivate their own backyard gardens, enabling them to consume a wider range of nutritious foods and sell surplus produce at the local market
- During Children's International day, 220 students were engaged in awareness and campaign on child rights and participated in drama and essay writing competition on the importance of nutrition and their rights to have balanced nutritional diet.






WATER SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH)

- The Joint Sector Review report for WASH first of its kind in PNG, was launched by WVPNG-led Water for Women PNG WASH Consortium in partnership with the Department of National Planning and Monitoring (DNPM) WASH Program Management Unit (PMU), providing critical insights to bolster safe drinking water and sanitation access across the country. The JSR Report was endorsed by the government agencies to provide a blueprint for WASH actors and investment in PNG for effective and coordinated actions going forwards.
- As part of the WVPNG's climate resilient WASH work, 15 boreholes were drilled and commissioned in 2023 in South Fly District of Western Province, which is the greatest number of boreholes drilled in PNG by a Civil Society Organisation (CSO). For the first time, had 20 communities declared open defecation free by the District Development Authority and Provincial Health Authority.
- District WASH plan was developed and launched in 2023 for South Fly, Western Province to provide strategic blueprint for next 5 years.
- Under support of DFAT Water for Women WAVE project, WV capacitate people with disabilities to participate and contribute in WASH decision making process via establishment of the Organisation of People with Disabilities in South Fly and Middle Fly Districts. This included developing TORs, capacity building, and creating a province-wide GEDSI framework.




- Through the EU funded project "Rispektim Yu Yet, Rispektim Narapela Na Yumi Sanap Wantaim" which focused on peace and livelihood, 374 youths successfully graduated from life skills and trade and vocational training such as welding, driving, tourism & hospitality, garment making and sewing, commercial cookery, carpentry, electrical and others.
- The UNDP funded project on "Enhancing communities in Southern Highlands" witnessed a Peace Agreement signed between four (Pira 1 & 2, Mapata 1 & 2) warning communities. This was as a result of implementing the peacebuilding training using the adapted Peace Road curriculum in the 15 targeted communities.
- Under UNDP Climate Change & Biodiversity Fund support, WVPNG commenced the deployment of the IFAD, Inshore Fishing Aggregating Device in the Riwo LLG, Madang Province. It is an innovation to be used as a conservation and management concept for the sustainability of the fisheries resources, especially from the reefs and allow the reefs to recover from climate change and overfishing.
- The DFAT-ANCP Climate Smart and Inclusive Cocoa project in Usino (CACAO) strives to improve cocoa profit through better access to inclusive market value chain of the smallholder farmers. A total of 3880 community members were reached through support such as farming tools & inputs; cooperative registrations and IPDM training.



- In collaboration with the Minderoo Foundation and with support from the University of Sydney's Brain and Mind Centre, WVPNG co-designed the Thrive by Five app which is available in both Tok Pisin and English and offers over 100 culturally tailored tips and activities for parents and caregivers to engage with their children aged 0-5 years, promoting healthy early childhood development in PNG.
- WVPNG conducted baseline exercise to inform design and planning of DFAT's Partnership for Improving Education Program 2022-30. Teachers, parents, school boards and students from 144 schools across 3 provinces (AROB, Enga and West Sepik) participated.

2023 Highlights

• Humanitarian and Relief:

Under USAID BHA support, WVPNG provided 3,633 people (1,781 female and 1,852 male) across 10 wards in at Wakunai and Torokina, who were displaced by the Mt Bagana volcano eruption in Bougainville in August 2023; with 56.896 metric tons of food package, bleach for water disinfection and hygiene, emergency latrines and hygiene promotion; while local actors were trained on Safeguarding and PSEA.

• Faith and Development

Under WVUS funding support, 93 faith leaders were trained in Celebrating Families module who in turn built capacity of 280 parents and caregivers in 5 churches for positive parenting. 192 staff member and other 74 faith leaders also enrolled into Empowered Worldview module that seeks to address dependency mindsets and promote individual empowerment.

Gender Equality, Disability, and Social Inclusion (GEDSI)

WV integrate GEDSI in all programs to promote equal and inclusive access, decision-making, participation. Specifically in Real Inclusion in Disability Engagement Project, WV conducted Organisational Capacity Assessment for 5 five key partners and OPDs, published barrier analysis "Giving Rise to Rights" on institutional gaps, set up OPD Directory and contextualized United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD). 127 people (80 government representative & partners and 41 OPD leaders) across 4 regions received UNCRPD ToT training.



World Vision PNG Financial Programming Expenditure - October 2022 - September 2023






