



## Situation Report #1030 | 31 December 2024 | Situation overview

In 2024, the situation in the Central African Republic remains concerning. As of calendar year end 2024, the Central African Republic had an estimated 465,499 internally displaced person (IDPs). Among them 16 per cent (73,638) live in sites while 84 per cent (391,861) live in host families. This represents an increase of 2,2% in terms of displacements compared to the previous report of August 2024.

Conflicts in neighboring Sudan and Chad have also impacted the vulnerability of populations, increasing the magnitude of needs in the northeast and northwest regions. Since the beginning of the Sudan crisis in April 2023, the Central African Republic has received 36,186 refugees and returnees as of December 2024 (29,826 refugees and 6,360 spontaneous returns). 83% of these refugees are women and children. A total of 26,794 Sudanese refugees have been biometrically registered and live in 13 localities, mostly in hard-to-reach locations outside Vakaga prefecture and need protection and assistance. Ongoing attacks between conflicting parties in Sudan continue to create risks of further displacement, potentially prompting additional groups of Sudanese refugees to cross the Am Dafock border. With the end of the rainy season improving road accessibility, increased refugee arrivals in CAR, including in Korsi, are anticipated.

In 2025, 2.4 million people - 38% of the population (estimated at 6,400,000) are extremely vulnerable, that humanitarian assistance alone is not sufficient to restore their well-being. The CAR 2025 Humanitarian Needs and Response Plan (HNRP) financial requirement stands at US\$326.1 million, representing a 11% decrease in the funding requested in 2024.

#### **Key concerns**



The number of reported cases of genderbased violence has seen an unfortunate increase, indicating the urgent need for intervention. Additionally, violations of human rights continue to persist. exemplified by the recruitment of children into armed groups.



The country has been severely impacted by armed conflict, leading to widespread violence, displacement, and human rights violations. Although some cities have been retaken by the Central African Armed Forces, armed groups continue to operate as criminal gangs, perpetrating violence against innocent civilians.



In addition, as of year-end 2024. 137.988 Chadian refugees were hosted in the Central African Republic (CAR) in the Sub-prefectures of Paoua, in the Lim-Pendé Prefecture, and Markounda. in the Ouham Prefecture in the northwest of the country, fleeing intercommunal conflicts involving an armed group.



The Central African government has granted Prima Facie refugee status to the 3.194 Chadians residing in Betoko[1]. Chadian refugees represent roughly 20% of the total number of refugees in the country.

# Central African Republic Emergency Response



#### World Vision's response goal

We have an ambitious goal: to positively **impact the lives of 5 million people, including 2.4 million children,** by end **2025** through increasing positive relationships, protection from violence, and improving nutrition and health.

#### Key response highlights (October 1- December 31, 2024)

This is the quarterly progress report covering the period of October 2024 to December 2024 marking the end of the first quarter of our fiscal year 25. During the reporting period, a total number of 414,382 (boys 130,413, girls 81,429, male 66,624, female 88,544) people received life-saving services across WV CAR programming as of December 31, 2024.



- 95,749 people reached with \$ 2,001,461 of cash and voucher assistance.
- 63,523 people reached with (in-kind) food assistance.
- 108,296 children receiving school feeding wet and or dry.
- 267,568 reached through Cash and Food Programming
- 2,559 community members sensitized on the Savings for Transformation (S4T) model
- 215 S4T created/strengthened
- 34,914 children reached by WV resilience programming
- **360** households provided with livelihood physical agricultural assets (e.g., agriculture seeds, tools, etc.)



## Water, Sanitation & Hygiene

- 4,000 people reached by WV supported programming on WASH
- 4,000 people gaining access to a basic drinking water collection point in communities
- 2,000 children reached by WV supported WASH programming

- **10,346 long-lasting insecticidal nets (LLIN)** distributed to targeted risk groups through continuous distribution.
- **1,793 LLIN** distributed to children (<5) distributed through routine campaigns.
- **21,234 women** supported to receive antenatal care services with at least 3 doses of intermittent preventive treatment
- 252,773 suspected malaria cases (<5) that received a parasitological test.
- **57,315 people** reached through WV's humanitarian assistance (Health interventions).
- 4,386 children reached by WV supported nutrition programming
- **18,890** children aged 12–59 months who received Penta3 vaccination
- **30,351** children reached by WV supported health programming



## **Child Protection, Social Cohesion & Advocacy**

- **5,899 children** directly benefited through our child protection activities to reduce violence against children.
- 266,332 children reached by WV Programming
- **1,643** children and adolescents who meaningfully participate in actions that support advocacy, mobilization and campaign initiatives
- 209,415 children reached through WV's humanitarian assistance
- 2 policymaking processes where children's voices were sought


