In Fiscal Year 2024 (FY24), 29 Micro Projects across 6 themes, with a budget of USD 97,886, significantly contributed to the well-being of children in the Area Programmes (APs).



Micro Projects - integral to the AP strategy are designed to empower local groups and partners to plan and manage their own development processes. These short-term, low-cost initiatives enhance child well-being and strengthen the capacity of local groups. Operating independently of existing technical programmes, these projects are planned, implemented, and monitored by community groups or partners, building their capacity and confidence.

All APs in West Field Office completed disability assessment to bridge the information gap regarding people with disabilities at the ward/local government level. Following a disability census conducted through the micro project, assessment findings were shared with local stakeholders followed by data verification and endorsement by local authorities. Furthermore, disability screening camps were organized, whereby **2,287 children and people with disabilities** received medical verification and assistive devices to support their daily lives.

Green Voice and Action

To empower communities to engage in environment stewardship Rautahat APs have implemented the Green Voice and Action Micro Project. The project has conducted Municipality-level school quiz competitions on the role of school and community in environmental conservation. Additionally, the project supported **10 schools** for tree plantation benefiting a total of **411 project participants**. Community people and child clubs were involved in the plantation. They were also participated in the policy-level dialogue that empowered them to advocate with the stakeholders on emerging issues in the community.

Child led Flash Mob to raise Online Safety Awareness

20 youths from Urban Kathmandu AP performed flash mobs to raise awareness on online safety and impact of substance abuse. Flash mobs were performed at six schools in Kirtipur and Kathmandu, engaging over **2,200 students and teachers**. The event successfully improved online safety awareness, resulting in positive impacts on children's well-being. Borrowing their learning from the event, one of the participants shared, **"We should not give our private information to anyone, and we should not accept friend request of unknown people."**



GIFT NOTIFICATION



Gift Notification (GN) is an amount sent by individual sponsors in addition to their monthly commitment to their sponsored children. A sponsor can send USD 100-200 in a year to their sponsored child. Children receive only one Gift Notification per year, and it can be referred to as Individual GN. GN allows children and families to fulfill their essential needs. This supports children’s health, education and livelihood.

Livelihood

"I have bought a sewing machine from your [sponsor's] special gift. My mother will sew clothes using this sewing machine. We will save the income generated through tailoring and pay my school fees and invest in my health", says Puja (5), Kanchanpur AP.



Health

"I have bought seven packet diapers from the special gift. I underwent an operation and have been suffering from urinary incontinence since then. Thus, diapers are essential for me", says Shristi (6), Lamjung AP.



Education

"We did not have money to buy notebook and pen. There were no proper bed for us to sleep. With educational support, I have been able to do my homework and with a bed, now, we have been able to sleep comfortably", says Laxmi (11), Sindhuli West AP.



COMMUNITY PORTION OF GN (CPGN)

From each of the Individual Gift Notification (GN), 25% of the gift amount is allocated towards a gift or activity that also benefits other children in the community, which is known as Community Portion of Gift Notification (CPGN).

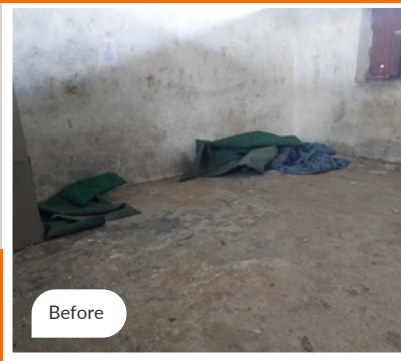
Play Material Installation in School, Lamjung

Children’s Park is one of the mandatory components of Child Friendly Local Governance. In collaboration with local government, Lamjung AP has completed the installation of child friendly playing materials in Karapureshwar Park, and Shree Janakalyan Secondary School. AP has prioritized these activities to ensure children have a good space for physical and mental development. A total of **298 children and families** have benefitted from CGPN budget in Lamjung AP.

"We go to children park to play together with friends during our holidays and enjoy playing", says Sangita, 11 years, Lamjung AP.

Irregular attendance and enrollment are common due to lack of child-friendly teaching and learning materials. In response, the community has utilized the CPGN budget to create a better learning environment in one Early Childhood Development Center (ECD), and two schools in Udayapur East AP. **650 project participants** have benefitted in total in Udayapur East AP.

"Previously, children were reluctant to come to school due to lack of carpets and P-Foam, which made them feel cold. I feel happy to see them attend school regularly nowadays", says Sujata, 28-year-old school teacher, Udayapur East AP.

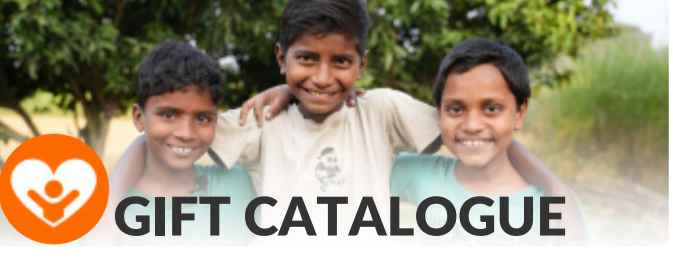

GIFT CATALOGUE

The **Gift Catalogue** project in Doti East, Achham East, Achham West and Sindhuli West APs supported warm blankets to children for the winter accompanied by shoes for school and sports equipment for extra curricular activities. Similarly, Menstrual Health Management (MHM) Training was conducted to raise Menstrual Health Awareness among adolescent girls in Mahottari West and Rautahat West APs. With a budget of USD 40,460, **16,692 project participants** have benefitted from this project.

NEW YEAR GIFT KIT (NYGK)

New Year Gift Kit has been a remarkable means of spreading a positive message and value of sponsorship among RC and their families. With a budget of **USD 1,779**, blankets, woolen caps, notebooks and pencils were distributed to **70 children** in Kanchanpur AP. Supported by WV Korea, it has contributed in addressing the need of community children especially in cold winter days and enhancing their academic endeavors.

"I along with 69 children received special gifts. I received a blanket, a cotton cap, 10 notebooks and 10 pencils. Blanket and cotton cap will keep in warm in winter. Notebooks and pencils will be helpful in my education. All 70 children are happy to receive this special gift", says Sushil, 9-year-old boy from Kanchanpur AP.

BIRTHDAY BOUNCE BACKS (BBB)

BBB are additional contributions from Sponsors to the community of their sponsored child. These contributions not only support enjoyable celebrations but also fund essential projects that benefit the entire community. In FY24, **12,007 project participants** have benefitted from BBB with a total budget of USD 28,689.



"We are very happy to celebrate our birthday like a big celebration which is the first time for many of us", says Gyanisha, 13 years, Sindhuli West AP.

A Step towards Environment Stewardship

4,916 people including children actively participated in the waste management orientation in Doti East AP. They learned about garbage classification, use of dustbins for disposing garbage, segregation of degradable and non-degradable wastes, concept of re-using and re-cycling.

"We collect and dispose litter in dustbins. This supports clean classroom and school environment", says Bhim, 15 years, Doti East AP.

Livestock Campaign is a project funded by World Vision Korea in Kanchanpur AP. Through livestock campaign, a pair of chickens were provided to **85 families** with a budget of **USD 1,109**. Livestock support has allowed families to include eggs in children's diet and becomes an additional source of income for the families through chicken rearing. It has remarkably contributed to communicating positive messages among most vulnerable children and families about WV's Child Sponsorship and its contribution towards community development.

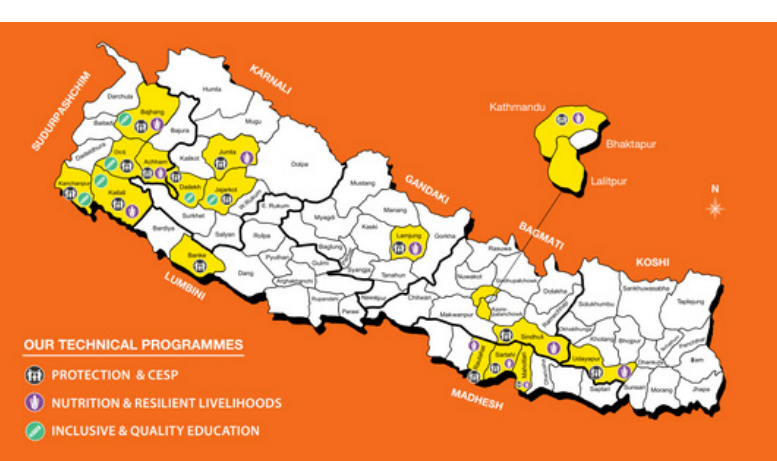
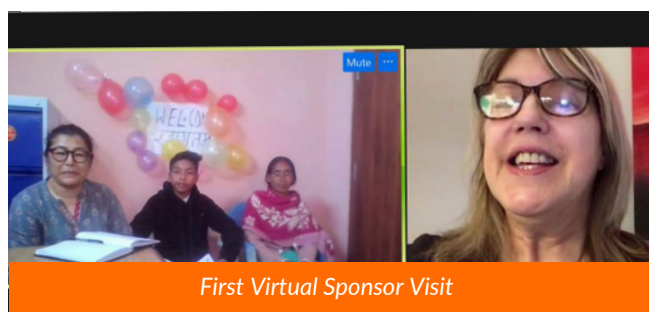

SPONSOR VISIT

FY24 closed with a total of **19 Sponsor Visits** from Switzerland, Australia, Singapore, Canada, Taiwan and the United Kingdom.

WVI Nepal has started Virtual Sponsor Visits for Individual and Group Virtual Visits, under the guidance and initiative that was piloted by WV UK to enhance their sponsor engagement.

In-person Sponsor Visits helped us secure additional funding for construction of school in Sindhuli East AP. Furthermore, a funding of USD 20,000 received post sponsor visit was used to organise Menstrual Health Management (MHM) orientation for adolescent girls in Malaysia funded APs.

With 71,282 children registered in Child Sponsorship, WVI Nepal is operating in 27 APs supported by 11 SOs. In FY25, we were able to maintain Green SOI (Sponsorship Service Operations Indicator) and Green CMS (Child Monitoring Standard), throughout the year with the average rating of 95% and 100% respectively.

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
