The initiative, called the "Ghana Drought: Category II (CAT 2) Response," provided cash transfers, training in climate-smart agriculture, and essential supplies, including certified drought-tolerant seeds. World Vision and Interplast Ghana Tackle WASH Challenges Together

World Vision Ghana has partnered with Interplast Ghana to advance the NSUPA WASH Facilities Project, securing Gifts-in-Kind (GIK) support. This collaboration, formalised through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), highlights Interplast's commitment to community development through impactful Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiatives. Interplast, a leading producer of plastic pipe systems in West Africa, has donated HDPE/UPVC pipes and fittings to support the construction of a solar-powered mechanised water system.

Dohia Declared Open Defecation Free Thanks to World Vision Ghana's WASH Initiative:

Dohia, a farming community in Ghana's Volta Region, has been declared open defecation free (ODF), significantly improving sanitation and public health. This milestone was achieved through World Vision Ghana's Community Led Total Sanitation (CLTS) approach, which encouraged household sanitation and trained local artisans to build durable toilets. Initially hesitant due to past failures, the community embraced the initiative after seeing successful examples like Edmond and Grace's family.

Bulungu Shea Processing Women's Group Drives Multiple Benefits from A Mechanised Water System:

In Bulungu, a farming community in Ghana's Northern Region, shea processing has long been the economic backbone for women. However, water scarcity posed significant challenges, forcing women and girls to walk miles for contaminated water, impacting their health and productivity. World Vision Ghana transformed their lives by providing a modern shea butter processing center with a mechanised water system, ensuring access to clean water. This intervention improved the quality and quantity of shea butter, boosting local and international demand.

Residents of Dohia, a farming community in Ghana's Volta Region, struggled with saving money due to past fraudulent schemes. The Faith Savings Group, part of World Vision Ghana's Savings for Transformation (S4T) initiative, has restored their confidence. This group of 25 members saves, invests, and supports each other, building financial security and new businesses. Daniel, a member recalls their initial skepticism but now appreciates the safe saving method. Mercy, a local farmer, has significantly increased her yield and supported her children's education.


