Brief Overview

In FY23-24, World Vision DRC made significant progress in improving the well-being of children and vulnerable communities through the effective integration of Gift-in-Kind (GIK) resources in various sectors. The organization has distributed essential items, and some items are still being distributed in certain sites, such as RUTFs, new clothes, long-sleeved shirts for women; long-sleeved dress shirts for men, size S-M; baby blankets; coated fabrics or plastic blankets in rolls; bicycles or bicycles, as well as the installation of solar panels, and it should be noted that 3-wheeled hand-cranked transporters for the disabled have already been distributed to beneficiaries.

These contributions have improved access to basic health services in remote areas, strengthened the capacity of the health system and enabled the health structures supported by World Vision to take on malnourished children who were previously dying of malnutrition. Foreword

On behalf of the WVDRC Office, I would like to express my most sincere thanks for the support you have given to the children and communities of the DRC. During Fiscal Year 24, our office received considerable support from Gift In Kind (GIK) donations, which contributed to the achievement of our objectives this year. We have managed to integrate these GIKs into our main areas of intervention, which are: health, sponsorship and protection.

Thanks to the integration of GIKs into our areas of intervention, World Vision DRC has enabled health facilities to take on malnourished children who were previously dying of malnutrition, and has significantly reduced the mortality rate of malnourished children admitted to these World Vision-supported facilities, since RUTFs are now available and patients are treated with a RUTF GIK. The GIK 3-wheeled hand-cranked transporters for the disabled and the medical supplies have improved the working conditions of health zone partners, with baby blankets, new clothes, long-sleeved shirts for women and long-sleeved dress shirts for men, which will protect parents and children from bad weather and respiratory diseases.

Our office still needs support in GIK because the needs are enormous in this very particular context, in all areas of intervention including Health, Wash, Livelihoods, Education and Protection in order to effectively achieve the objectives for the well-being of children.

Once again, on behalf of the Congolese people, I sincerely thank you for your valuable contribution.

World Vision DRC is dedicated to serving the most vulnerable children in all geographic areas where our programs are deployed. Our efforts in the fiscal years 2023 and 2024 focused on integrating in-kind donation (GIK) resources into a few priority areas and collaborating with strategic partners to achieve overall child welfare goals.

Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH)

GIK Beneficiaries: 50,000+

Impact: The solar panels have enabled some 50,000 direct beneficiaries to change their lives and be protected against water-borne diseases by having reliable water sources with sustainable economic systems and healthier communities. The solar solution has offered a safer, more prosperous future for all.

- In 2020 WV received a donation of 364 solar panels, most of which were installed in 2023 in the following PAs: Gbadolit , Kasungami, Rwashi, Luwowoshi, kipushi, Kigoma, Toyota, Kikula, Simba, Fungurume, Kisunka, Mutoshi, Kolwezi, Menkao, Kenge, Kwango, Loma, Kasangulu, Kisantu, Kintanu, south zone office, Kolwezi and mutoshi cluter (Lualaba, Maisha) et Likasi 1 et 2 clusters





Maternal and Child Health

GIK Beneficiaries: 20 Health Centers

Impact: These donations will improve access to basic health services in remote areas, strengthen the capacity of the health system and enable the health structures supported by World Vision to care for malnourished children who were previously dying of malnutrition. These donations will enable a significant reduction in the mortality rate of malnourished children admitted to World Vision-supported facilities, as RUTFs are now available and patients are being treated.

- During the FY23, we received a donation of 3 containers of RUTF (2,700 cartons) valued at \$113,400. This shipment was distributed to beneficiaries through a HUAMS Grant financed by Agence Française de Développement (AFD) and implemented in the North Kivu province of Beni territory. This donation enabled malnourished children in the Beni health zone to be cared for and regain good health.
- We received a shipment of four containers of RUTF worth a total of 123,750.02 USD, as well as a storyteller of medical supplies worth 12,000 USD.
- It should be noted that a donation of three (3) RUTF storytellers worth total of 2700 cartons worth 83,700 USD was distributed through a HUAMSI project financed by Agence Française de Développement (AFD) implemented in the province of North Kivu (territory of Beni) in Beni health zone to serve 20 health centers and a RUTF container 900 cartons worth 40,050.02 USD, will be distributed to Area Programmes (APs Ledia, Maluku, Kwango, Ngandu, Bukanga Lonzo, Kenge) and a PNS Binza Childhood Rescue project in Binza.



Sponsorship / child protection

GIK Beneficiaries: 20 Health Centers

Impact: (2,772 children + 42 disabled people + 345 children) the 2,772 children, including 1,532 girls and 1,240 boys, are protected from the elements and the cold, enabling them to work during the cold season and look after their children. the conditions of the 42 disabled people are improved, the 345 children are protected from disease and their health is strengthened through physical activities.

- we have received a donation of clothes, baby blankets, coated fabrics, 3-wheeled disabled transporters and bicycles or bicycles worth 12,000USdollars.

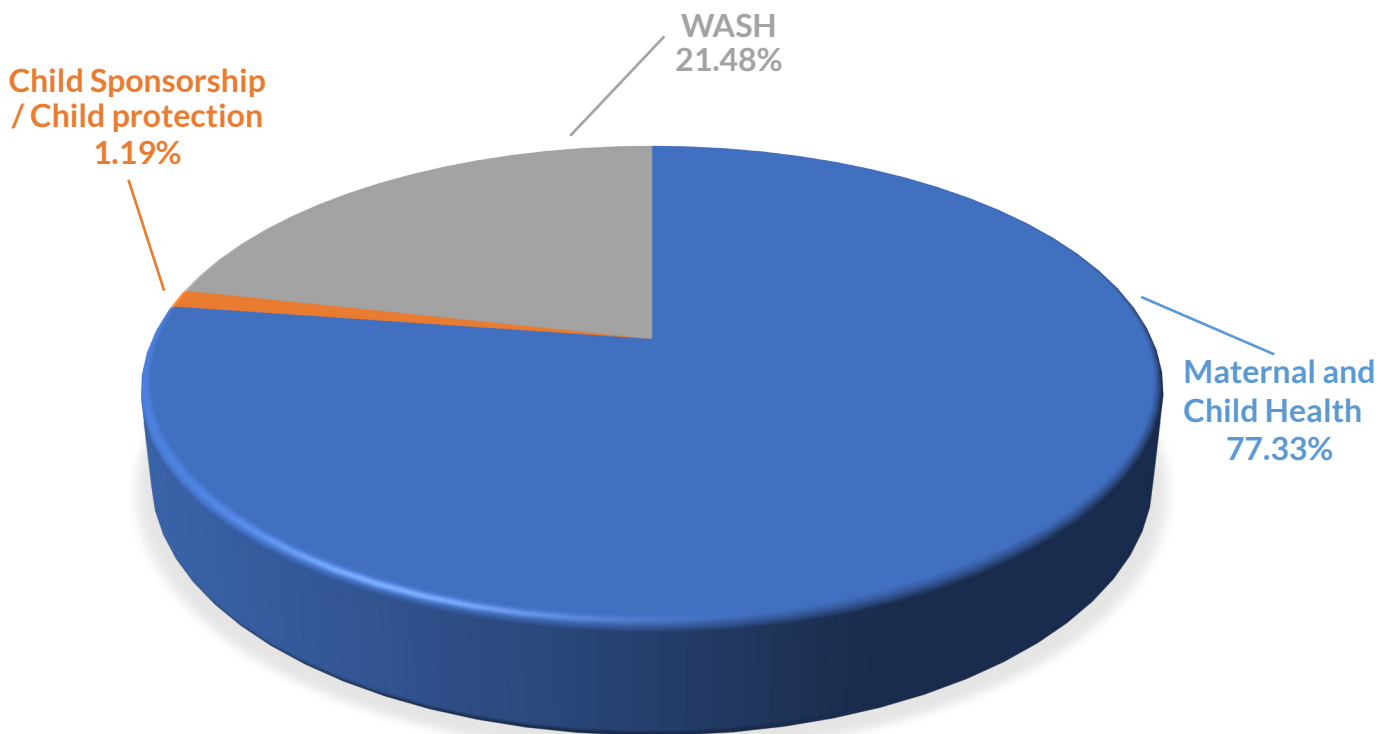
